Course Description

The traditional view of a bully is that of a big, strong kid picking on a weaker, smaller kid, stealing lunch money or calling other kids names. Adults have experience recognizing this kind of behavior because it's a subject that they understand. With cyberbullying, parents and educators face a much more sophisticated challenge.

What makes cyberbullying so challenging is that it can figuratively fly below the radar, sometimes for a very long time. Additionally, staff or parents who are not computer-savvy may not fully understand the implications of cyberbullying.

In this course, the learner will gain understanding about how cyberbullying differs from conventional forms of bullying, recognizing how cyberbullying is often able to go undetected, and finally identifying measures that can be taken by children and adults to stop or prevent cyberbullying.
