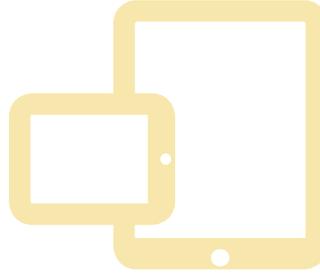


## Racial Profiling: Part 1 Online Training Program

Racial profiling, the practice of using race or ethnicity as a basis for law enforcement investigative procedures.
