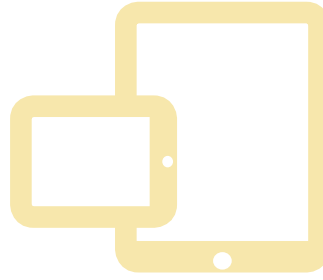


Individual Classroom Plans Online Training Program
